



## • • WHY SHOULD VFC PROVIDERS USE CAIR?

The California Immunization Registry (CAIR) puts tools to manage your federally-funded vaccines at your fingertips. Using CAIR increases productivity—saving you time, money, helping your patients and making their lives (and yours) easier! CAIR is sponsored by the California Department of Public Health and permitted by law. Thousands of California medical practices already participate. Enrolling is easy and participation, including all training and technical support, is free.

## • • WHAT BENEFITS CAN VFC PROVIDERS EXPECT FROM CAIR?

### Vaccine Management

- CAIR offers vaccine usage and inventory reports. You can keep track of both your privately-purchased and VFC-supplied vaccines.
- CAIR tracks vaccine expiration dates so you can use vaccines before they expire.

### Vaccine Quality Assurance Compliance

- CAIR centralizes required information for vaccine administration (i.e., patient VFC eligibility screening, shot date, manufacturer, lot number, & date VIS sheet given).
- CAIR helps you comply with administering ACIP-recommended vaccines and schedules.
- CAIR gets you ready for VFC program audits by producing vaccine coverage reports, helping your office reduce missed opportunities to vaccinate. Most practices see their rates go up!

### VFC Recertification

- CAIR gives you the information you need to easily complete your annual VFC program recertification.

### Reminders and Recalls

- CAIR automates which patients are due, or past due, for shots—and prints labels for routine reminder postcards, a recommended practice for all VFC providers.
- CAIR tracks patients during a vaccine shortage, so it's easy to recall patients who need catch-up shots. And if a vaccine lot is ever recalled, you know exactly which patients were affected.
- CAIR identifies patients with medical deferments or other exemptions.
