

Jeffery Goad is the new President of CIC

Associate Professor Jeffery Goad, PharmD, MPH, has been elected the new president of the California Immunization Coalition (CIC).



The position marks a recognition of Goad's work in the field, as a long-time advocate for immunization and for the ability of pharmacists to immunize in the community pharmacy setting.

Jeffery A. Goad is an Associate Professor of Clinical Pharmacy at the University of Southern California School of Pharmacy. He received his Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of Southern California School of Pharmacy in 1994 and Masters of Public Health from the USC Keck School of Medicine in 2003. He completed a residency in pediatric pharmacy practice at Children's Hospital Los Angeles and holds the Certificate of Knowledge in Travel Health from the International Society of Travel Medicine.

Jeff Goad was an active member of the California Adult Immunization Coalition before becoming a member of the merged California Immunization

Coalition in 2007 and readily accepted an invitation to serve as a CIC Board member at that time. Jeff has been active on the CIC Emerging Issues and Advocacy Committees and in 2009 began serving as Governance Chair where he has overseen the development and implementation of numerous guidelines and policy documents for CIC.

"Over the years, I've had the honor of participating in the merger of the California Adult and Pediatric Coalitions and then serving on the board in various capacities," says Goad. "The CIC exemplifies the spirit of collaboration between medicine, pharmacy and public health and I'm proud to represent pharmacists in the increasingly important role they play in immunizing Californians."

Erika Jenssen is the new Vice President of CIC

Erika has served as a Board member of CIC since 2008 and has participated in the Board as Registry Chair and the Summit Planning Committee. Through her experience working with local Coalitions, immunization registries on the local, state and national level, emergency response and clinic coordination, and working with the media, Erika brings a broad, unique and extremely valuable perspective to the Coalition.



After receiving her MPH in Policy/Administration from UC Berkeley in 1995, Ms. Jenssen began working for the Immunization Program as the Immunization Coalition Coordinator. That same year the Contra Costa Automated Immunization Registry was developed and for the next six years, Ms. Jenssen focused on the implementation and expansion of the Immunization Registry and in 2001 received the "Best Use of Data" award from Every Child by Two at the National Immunization Registry Conference in Little Rock, AR.

After three years serving as Health Emergency Coordinator for Contra Costa Health Services, Erika returned to her position of Immunization Coordinator where she supervised the Immunization Registry, four Immunization Clinics, quality assurance programs, school assessments, health promotion and education campaigns and the Contra Costa Public Health Department's annual influenza immunization campaign. Erika recently accepted the position of Communicable Disease Programs Manager for the Contra Costa Public Health Department.

The CIC Board of Directors are thrilled and appreciative that Erika Jenssen and Jeff Goad have agreed to take on these leadership roles.

Spotlight on Coalitions: Arizona Partnership for Immunization

Protection against vaccine-preventable diseases doesn't stop at the border. Since 1993, Arizona has had a strong immunization coalition, the Arizona Partnership for Immunization, or TAPI. TAPI is a non-profit statewide coalition with more than 400 members. TAPI was formed because only 43% of Arizona's two-year-olds were fully immunized against preventable childhood diseases like measles, mumps, polio and whooping cough. Through the



efforts of TAPI's partners from both the public and private sectors, immunization coverage rates in Arizona improved dramatically, with nearly three in four children fully immunized by age two. Unfortunately, the challenge never ends. Each year in Arizona almost 90,000 babies are born, and none arrive immunized. TAPI's mission is to foster a comprehensive, sustained community program for the immunization of Arizonans. TAPI members do this by promoting on-time childhood immunizations, and by encouraging appropriate immunizations through the lifespan.

TAPI promotes immunizations through a variety of national and local initiatives. In 2011 Arizona had the unique honor of being chosen as the launch state for the NIIW campaign. Each spring, TAPI hosts Big Shots for Arizona, a celebration that recognizes organizations and individuals who have improved the health and wellness of Arizona's communities through increasing immunization rates. In addition, TAPI offers a number of immunization trainings and resources for parents, providers and the community. 
