ARRA Project Updates Virtual Immunization Community Network

With thanks to the hundreds of immunization partners across the country who completed the Immunization Communication Survey sent out in February, the NPHIC/CIC team is preparing to launch our first webinar and other announcements about future trainings.

Based on survey results the project will conduct a series of live webinars led by leading experts that address vaccine safety communication, evidence-based strategies for improving immunization rates, alternative immunization settings and immunization coalition capacity issues including fundraising and membership/partnership development. The webinars will be held before and during the Virtual Immunization Symposium which will be held in the Spring of 2011.

The on-line **Virtual Immunization Symposium** will be the centerpiece of this two-year technical assistance project funded by American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds and will enable participants from throughout the country to interact and network with one another virtually. A dedicated website will serve as the hub for participants to participate in the learning labs and webinars and will also feature chat rooms and a blog for users to communicate with other participants and speakers.

CDPH's statewide texting campaign helped kick-off National Influenza Vaccine week in mid-January and runs through March.Behind the scenes, the Immunization Branch manages the vaccine location database, develops text message responses, and promotes the campaign through outdoor advertising, web banners and the media. Billboards can be seen from the highway and where bus passengers wait for their ride.

The first week of the campaign successfully drove in nearly 1,000 text messages with location inquiries across CA. The Immunization Branch is now working on evaluating its effectiveness with follow-up text messages. The same cell phone users were texted an evaluation message which read "This is the CA Dept of Public Health. Thx for txting to find how to get your H1N1 vaccine. Did u/family get H1N1 vaccine @ loc txted to u? Reply YES or NO."

Hat Trick for Kern County's Preteen Vaccine Week (PVW) Campaign



Kern County scored big during their 2010 Preteen Vaccine Week (PVW) campaign by promoting preteen vaccines with unique

partners, like the Bakersfield Condors hockey team, local high school campuses, and through partnerships with local media.

Partnering with the Bakersfield Condors Hockey franchise turned out to be a great team effort. At a home game held during PVW, the Condors promoted PVW on the score board and provided space for the Coalition's info booth. The game had more than 6000 fans in attendance! One of their most popular players even posed for "I Choose" posters. In return, the Condors are promoted-and supported-by coalition members.

The Kern campaign also reached out directly to the teens and preteens. Kern County Public Health and National Health Services Inc. have a 3-year grant which includes hosting immunization clinics in four local high schools. During PVW they promoted the campaign on campus and also offered H1N1 shots to students, their families and members of the surrounding communities.

Another successful approach was to partner with local media and advertisers. Coalition members appeared on a morning TV show, an English-language radio program, and on a Punjabi-language radio station.

Thanks to Kern County Department of Public Health, messages in English and Spanish were flash / displayed on five area electronic billboards. Each day, for 28 days, 2,220 messages promoted PVW and H1N1 vaccination - that's more than 310,000 pro immunization messages! In addition, Kern County Public Health Department promoted PVW and advertised available shot clinics in local community newspapers.
